Re: OIA request - Did not attend numbers for appointments

Thank you for your Official Information Act request received 16 February 2021 seeking information about DNA rates from Waitematā District Health Board (DHB).

Before responding to your specific questions, it may be useful to provide some context about our services.

Waitematā is the largest and one of the most rapidly growing DHBs in the country, serving a population of around 650,000 across the North Shore, Waitakere and Rodney areas. We are the largest employer in the district, employing around 8,500 people across more than 80 locations.

In addition to providing care to our own resident population, we are the Northern Region provider of forensic mental health services and child rehabilitation services, plus the metro Auckland provider of child community dental services and community alcohol and drug services.

In response to your request, we can provide the following information:

For the past five years, from 30 June 2016 to 30 June 2020:

1. What information does Waitematā DHB record regarding patients who do not arrive for their appointments across all health specialties? Please provide details by did not attend (DNA) volume and DNA rate by each health speciality.

The DHB records a status of DNA within our patient management system against all patients that have a booked outpatient appointment and do not either cancel or reschedule this appointment up until the arrival time of this appointment. If a patient misses an appointment, it is a clinical decision whether the appointment requires rescheduling. The clinician is responsible for making the decision regarding the outcome for the patient being either "DNA re-book" or "DNA discharge back to the care of GP". Where patients are discharged back to the care of their GP, the GP is notified by letter that their patient did not attend the appointment.

Patient volumes were lower than expected in 2020 due to the impacts of COVID-19-related lockdowns and alert levels in the Auckland region.

2. Is the cost of DNAs calculated across each health specialty and, if so, is this reported to the Board? If so, please provide those details for the five years from 30 June 2016 to 30 June 2020.

Waitematā, like all DHBs, follows the Ministry of Health's national framework of common costing standards, which attaches no stand-alone costs to DNAs. The cost of providing services assumes that there will be a proportion of people who do not attend their appointments and these costs are built-in to the overall funding for providing services.

As we do not measure or report the costs of DNAs, we are refusing this aspect of your request under section 18(g)(i) as the information requested is not held by Waitematā DHB and we have no grounds to believe that the information is held by another agency.

Waitematā DHB supports the open disclosure of information to assist community understanding of how we are delivering publicly funded healthcare. If you consider there are good reasons why this response should not be made publicly available, we will be happy to consider your views.
