Re: Official Information Act request - Babies born to drug dependent mothers

Thank you for your Official Information Act request of 18 July 2019 seeking the following of Waitematā District Health Board (DHB):

- Over the past five years (since January 2014), how many babies have been born under the care of Waitematā District Health to mothers dependent on illegal drugs?
- How many of those babies were uplifted by Oranga Tamariki?
- How many of those babies required a hospital stay of more than 7 days?
- How many of those babies required a hospital stay of more than 14 days?
- How many of those babies required medication as a result of withdrawal symptoms?

Waitematā DHB operates two maternity facilities — one at North Shore Hospital and one at Waitakere Hospital. In a typical 12-month period, our maternity services will be involved in the birth of approximately 7,000 babies.

Women who live in Waitematā DHB with a known drug addiction are generally referred to Auckland DHB to receive care under a specialist team. However, there are some women who have their baby at one of our facilities. This is generally because they have not registered for maternity care or they have support systems in place that would mean that giving birth locally would be advantageous to them.

The table below provides the information you have requested, alongside the total number of births for each calendar year.
